My current knowledge, training, and practice relate to neuropsychological assessment and therapy. I do not accept instructions relating to children, adolescents, general psychological/psychiatric disorders or forensic psychology.

- Clinical assessment of neuropsychological conditions – weekly/continuous

- Formal psychometric assessment including performance validity testing – weekly/continuous.
- Reporting of assessments, including CPR-compliant expert reports – weekly/continuous.
- Mental Capacity Assessments and reporting, including COP3 completion.
- Community based neuro-rehabilitation, including individual therapy with patients and their families (fortnightly).
- Multidisciplinary liaison, team working and training (monthly/bi-monthly)
